Spinning is an ancient textile art in which plant, animal or synthetic fibres are drawn out and The origins of spinning fibre to make string or yarn are lost in time, but archaeological evidence in the form of representation of string skirts has been.

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When done prior to spinning, this often leads to unusable wool fibre. Spinners then have available pre-dyed fibre, or blends of fibres, which are hard to create when the wool is still in the grease. You may also like.

It is spun from combed rovings, liver or wool top. However, Clayton stresses that once you make the investment in a wheel you will never have to buy another one. The distaff was used for holding the bunch of wool, flax or other fibres.

Such spinners generally buy their fibres pre-washed and carded, in the form of Class. The class shows our set-up with the wheels and fleece. It was such a pleasure to see so many dying arts and crafts alive and well at the folk school and I realized that there are so many other things I want to learn.
