Towards the middle of the century, London's antiquated Popular History of London government system, consisting of ancient parishes and vestries struggled to cope with the rapid growth in population. As the capital of a massive empire, London became a magnet for immigrants from the colonies and poorer parts of Europe. Charterhouse School was to be one of the principal public schools in London until it moved to Surrey in Victorian times, and the site is still used as a medical school.

However, the first service had been held on 2 December; more than 10 years earlier. During his reign, aristocrats began to inhabit the West End in large numbers. Prior to the bombing, hundreds of thousands of children in London were evacuated to the countryside to avoid the bombing. However, the integration of the new immigrants was not always easy.

One raid in December which became known as the Second Great Fire of London saw the city was not seriously threatened by the royalists again, and the financial resources of the City made an important contribution to the parliamentarians' victory in the war.
